The incumbent in this position is also the Executive Officer of the South Australian Commission for Catholic Schools (SACCS) and the Director of Catholic Education SA.

Catholic Education in South Australia includes 104 schools, 47,000 students and 6,000 staff across the Archdiocese of Adelaide and the Diocese of Port Pirie. It includes 16 separately incorporated bodies which administer Catholic schools in South Australia.

SACCS is the policy making body for all Catholic schools in South Australia. Its role includes relationships with government and distribution of funding.

The Archdiocese of Adelaide owns and operates 73 schools for which the Director has delegated responsibility from His Grace, Archbishop Philip Wilson.

This is an exciting and challenging position which is critical to the vitality and authenticity of Catholic Education SA.

The successful applicant will demonstrate:

- significant and outstanding senior leadership experience in Catholic education.
- fidelity to his/her own faith journey, prayer life and practice of the Catholic faith
- outstanding leadership, management and interpersonal skills.
